Dr. Stacy Elliott is a Sexual Medicine Physician whose interests lie in the sexual and reproductive consequences of medical or surgical problems, particularly neurological disability. She is a Clinical Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and an Associate member of the Department of Urologic Sciences, University of British Columbia. She is the Medical Director of the BC Center for Sexual Medicine, a Vancouver Hospital based tertiary care clinic that includes clinical care, teaching and research. She is also the Co-Director for the Vancouver Sperm Retrieval Clinic (VSRC) with Dr. Mark Nigro. The VSRC sees men with sexual problems (mainly ejaculatory) precluding their ability to be biological fathers. Both partners are seen, evaluated and followed at this unique clinic and the VSRC works closely with IVF clinics in the lower mainland of Vancouver. The VSRC has participated in the conception of over 100 live births to date. The VSRC is to be transferred to the new Blusson (spinal cord) Center in 2009. Dr. Elliott is also the Sexual Medicine physician consultant to the Sexual Health Rehabilitation Program at GF Strong Rehabilitation Centre. She also works with Doctors Goldenberg and Davison at the Prostate Centre facilitating sexual rehabilitation for those men with prostate cancer.

Dr. Elliott is a well-recognized Canadian expert in the field of male sexual dysfunction and an invited international speaker. She is currently the Chair of the Canadian Male Sexual Health Council, and participates on national and international advisory boards of erection enhancement and hypogonadal treatments and on academic panels for neurological disability. She is the author of many peer-reviewed papers and several book chapters and teaches at the UBC Medical School. She is also involved in many clinical and academic research trials as either principle or co – investigator in the area of sexual functioning in prostate cancer and spinal cord injury, and is an active faculty member and researcher of the prestigious International Collaboration of Repair Discoveries (ICORD).
